| IAH 20* | Fulfills first of two arts and humanities requirements for all majors; honors college and ASP <br> students should enroll in the honors section |
| ISB 20* | Fulfills general biology requirement for some majors; not recommended for honors college <br> students or students who take biology, ecology, or plant biology as part of their major <br> (those pursuing a BS degree) |
| ISP 203A | Fulfills general physical science requirement for some majors; not recommended for honors <br> college students or students who take chemistry, geology, or physics for their major (those <br> pursuing a BS degree) |
